The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) offers free camping and day-use parking to Oregon **foster**, **guardian**, and **foster- adoptive** parents and their children. Please note this fee waiver is for state parks only. If you have any questions about the program or the ID card, please call 1-800-551-6949, Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, or email [special.access@oregon.gov](mailto:special.access@oregon.gov). Families may camp overnight for free in a tent, RV or standard horse camp site for up to 14 nights in a calendar month. Pass does not apply to yurts, cabins, or other special park facilities. The pass does apply to foster parents and children visiting the 26 parks that charge a day-use parking fee. The benefit is valid only when both the pass holder and eligible children are present.
