The first place to seek resources for a young person in care is ALWAYS their Tribe or Nation, including the <u>nine strong federally recognized Tribes & Nations in Oregon</u>. These new pages are just meant to supplement with additional examples of their rich culture and heritage.














It's Your Story!

Hello Adoption and Guardianship Families! The Post Adoption and Guardianship Unit hopes your family finds time to slow down and rest with all of the busyness of life. We have big news: Ms. Cathy Reeves is now rightfully enjoying retirement. We have hired a new Coordinator, Sarah Koroush, who started with the team in January 2024! We are excited she has joined our team as she has years of experience working with families and is a great asset to our group. 














Supporting Your Adoptive & Guardianship Family With KEEP



Favorite takeaways from TAC?

My favorite part about TAC was the information provided on the different perspectives of everyone within the adoption kinship network. This information was eye-opening as an adoptee and made me think about my adoption from my birth parents and adoptive family point of view. I've never done that before.



Your experience with your TAC colleagues?

I enjoyed meeting everyone virtually in the cohort. We all got along well and were supportive of each other whenever we disclosed personal information.

What has TAC meant to you as an adoptee?

I believe more TAC-trained therapists are needed in the field. As an adoptee, it is difficult to talk with a therapist who doesn't approach therapy through the lens of adoption. Having more TAC-trained therapists will provide adoptees the opportunity to fully process the trauma around their adoption and the aftermath.

Your practice focus area?

My area of focus is working with adoptees who need help processing their adoption, incorporating EMDR, and possibly one day neurofeedback.
