




Portland Parks & Rec Early Registration Program




Favorite takeaways from TAC?

My most appreciated part about TAC was connecting with others who are interested, advocates, or fellow adoptees. Also, learning about the origin of adoption in the United States was a different approach to my understanding of adoption.

Your experience with your TAC colleagues?

Overall, I felt that my cohort was extremely caring, knowledgeable, and interested in learning.



As an adoptee I do see someone who has understanding or real-life experience with adoption as a more beneficial fit for those experiencing or who have experienced adoption. It allows for connection or at least a shared starting point of understanding.

Your practice focus area?

I speak mostly English but do know a fair amount of Spanish and Chinese. I focus mostly on attachment, anxiety, depression, and working with those with complex trauma.


