#### **HELPING FAMILIES STAY TOGETHER**

Youth Villages Oregon's YVIntercept program is an intensive in-home services program that specializes in:

- Providing treatment to children who have mental health, emotional and behavioral problems and their families in their own homes at times convenient for the families. These services generally occur over a four-tosix month period.
- Supporting families of all types, including: biological, adoptive, foster and friends, neighbors, etc. Our team is specially trained to meet each family where they are and work toward long-term stability, safety and health.
- Diverting youth from out-of-home placements by helping their families safely maintain youth in the home and community environment.
- Reuniting youth who have been placed out of their homes successfully.
   YVIntercept family intervention specialists are skilled at reuniting families even when the child has been out of the home for an extended period. We reunite youth who are receiving mental health, juvenile justice or child welfare services.

#### ABOUT THE YVINTERCEPT PROGRAM

Over the past 20 years, Youth Villages has provided intensive in-home services for more than 52,000 children and families. We've helped over 31,000 children and families in the last 10 years alone in our YVIntercept program. We have demonstrated through our follow-up process that at two years post discharge 88% of youth who received YVIntercept services are successful. Youth Villages offers communities and governments a better alternative for youth involved in the state child welfare, juvenile justice and mental health systems.



#### YOUTH VILLAGES' FAMILY INTERVENTION SPECIALISTS OFFER VITAL SERVICES THAT INCLUDE:

- Helping the entire family, rather than just the child.
- Meeting with families and youth an average of three times each week and <u>being on call 24/7</u> to help the family in case of emergency.
- Working with <u>small caseloads</u> four to six families focusing on helping the child and family at home, in school and in the community.
- Providing a <u>comprehensive treatment approach</u> that includes family treatment, parenting skills education, educational interventions, development of positive peer groups and extensive help for families and children in accessing community resources and long-term, ongoing support.
- Identifying specific goals and assigning measurable tasks to the child and family. Family intervention specialists also develop targeted interventions until the family reaches the goals established in the treatment plan.
- Engaging families in their role of supervising and supporting their

- children including consistency, discipline and communication.
- <u>Implementing strategies</u> to address aggression, problem sexual behavior and other specialized issues.
- <u>Collaborating with providers, case workers and courts</u> to formulate a collaborative treatment direction to resolve family and child issues.
- Providing crisis prevention and intervention.
- Conducting <u>extensive family searches</u>.
- Providing <u>psychiatric treatment</u>, <u>Collaborative Problem Solving</u>, <u>Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy</u> and Adolescent-Community Reinforcement Approach, an alcohol and drug intervention program for youth (on an as-needed basis).

  safety and health.
