

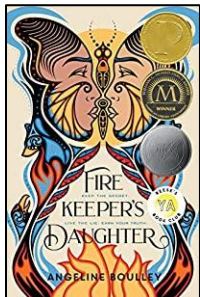


ORPARC Library Grows Its Tribal Collection!

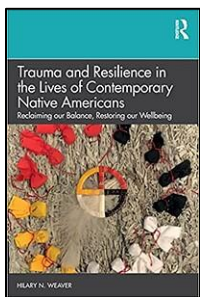
Overview of the Nine Tribal Nations

We acknowledge that ORPARC's library serves the entire state of Oregon which sits on the ancestral, traditional and contemporary lands stolen from and belonging to indigenous peoples since Time Immemorial, and home to nine federally recognized Tribal Nations: **Burns Paiute of Harney County**, primarily the descendants of the "Wadatika" band of Paiute Indians that roamed in central and southern Oregon; **Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians**, which includes two bands of Coos Tribes: Hanis Coos (Coos Proper), Miluk Coos; Lower Umpqua Tribe; and Siuslaw Tribe; **Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde**; **Confederated Tribes of Siletz**, a federally recognized confederation of 27 bands, originating from Northern California to Southern Washington; **Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Reservation**, a union of three Tribes: Cayuse, Umatilla, and Walla Walla; **Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs**, land of the Warm Springs, Wasco and Paiute Native American Tribes; **Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians**; **Coquille Indian Tribe**; and **Klamath Tribes**, the Klamath, Modoc and Yahooskin Peoples; and additional citizens from countless Tribes. 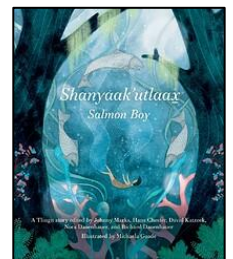

In building the collection, ORPARC is leaning on Tribal-curated lists through sources like the American Indian Library Association, National Library of Medicine and First Nations Development Institute, and is purchasing the majority of materials from Tribal booksellers.
